SEMINARS AND CONTINUING EDUCATION

We have defined our commitment for education in Texas for workers' compensation. The State Board of Insurance requires a minimum of 15 hours annually to maintain license.

We will permanently from year to year offer the following:

- (a) 5.0 Credit Hours - Public Seminars (seminar costs waived for client adjusters or underwriters).

San Antonio - 1st Wednesday in April annually

Houston - 2nd Wednesday in April annually

Dallas - 4th Wednesday in April annually

(We have a very large list of subscribers to our Texas Workers Compensation Manual which dictates making public seminars available.)

- (b) 5.0 Credit Hours - Tape Seminars for clients only. We will target those hard to locate requirements, such as bad faith or other current State Board of Insurance mandates. We are presently working on a bad faith presentation which will be available by June, 1991.
- (c) 5.0 Credit Hours - Our traditional Austin Seminar for clients only. Recommended for claim managers and supervisors. In the future, this seminar will always be on the 2nd Monday in October.
